

## Bible Study Topic: Jesus and Moses: A Biblical Comparison

Category	Moses	Jesus
<b>Birth and Early Life</b>	Born in Egypt; Pharaoh ordered the killing of Hebrew baby boys (Exodus 1-2).	Born in Bethlehem; King Herod ordered the killing of male infants (Matthew 2:16).
<b>Call and Mission</b>	Called to deliver Israel from physical slavery in Egypt (Exodus 3:10).	Came to deliver humanity from spiritual slavery to sin (Luke 4:18, John 8:34-36).
<b>Miraculous Signs</b>	Performed miracles, including the plagues, parting of the Red Sea, and providing manna (Exodus 7-14).	Performed miracles such as healing the sick, feeding the 5,000, walking on water, and raising the dead (John 20:30-31).
<b>Intercessor &amp; Mediator</b>	Stood between God and Israel, interceding on their behalf (Exodus 32:11-14).	The ultimate mediator between God and humanity (1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 9:15).
<b>The Law &amp; Covenant</b>	Received the Law (Ten Commandments) on Mount Sinai and gave Israel God's covenant (Exodus 20).	Gave the new covenant through His blood, fulfilling the Law (Matthew 5:17, Luke 22:20).
<b>Sacrificial Role</b>	Offered sacrifices for the sins of Israel (Leviticus 8:15, Numbers 14:19-20).	Became the perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world (John 1:29, Hebrews 9:26).
<b>Leadership</b>	Led Israel through the wilderness for 40 years (Exodus 16-17, Numbers 14:33).	Leads His people spiritually as the Good Shepherd (John 10:11, Hebrews 2:10).
<b>Bread from Heaven</b>	Provided manna from heaven to feed Israel (Exodus 16:14-15).	Declared Himself the "Bread of Life" that gives eternal life (John 6:32-35).
<b>Passover Connection</b>	Instituted the Passover, where the blood of a lamb saved Israel (Exodus 12).	Became the Passover Lamb, whose blood saves believers (1 Corinthians 5:7, John 1:29).
<b>Water Miracles</b>	Parted the Red Sea to save Israel (Exodus 14:21-22).	Walked on water and calmed the storm (Matthew 14:25-32).
<b>Rejection</b>	Rejected by his own people at times (Exodus 2:14, Numbers 14:10).	Rejected by His own people, leading to His crucifixion (John 1:11, Luke 23:18-21).
<b>Death</b>	Died before entering the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 34:5-6).	Died on the cross but rose again to give eternal life (Luke 24:6-7).
<b>Final Glory</b>	Appeared with Jesus at the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:3).	Will return in glory as King of Kings (Revelation 19:16).
